[16~17] 다음을 듣고, 물음에 답하십시오.

W: Hello, class! Last week, we discussed how various shapes are used for different purposes. Today, we'll talk about colors and their psychological effects on people. Let's take a look at how they are used in real life. The color blue, one of the most popular colors, makes people feel more trusting. Banks and insurance companies use blue to gain trust. The color green does the same as blue in that it inspires trust. In addition, it can also be welcoming. Think of hotel lobbies. Many of them use green in some way. Then, there's a color that can reduce anxiety. Do you have any guesses? Well, that color is pink. Not surprisingly, waiting rooms in hospitals are often painted this color.
