You've probably heard of the voyages of Christopher Columbus, but do you know there were many oceanic explorers before Columbus? One group that we'll learn about is the Vikings who began raiding Europe in the 8th century. By the 11th century, they had established trade routes from the Arctic to the Middle East and had even crossed the Atlantic Ocean.
