Scientists have found a number of animals with incredible senses in terms of seeing, hearing, and smelling. For example, falcons, a species of bird, are able to see a small object from 1.5 kilometers away. They can also see images clearly even while diving at 160 kilometers per hour. Another example is elephants. They can hear sounds between the range of 1 and 20,000 hertz. This means elephants can hear sounds that humans cannot. Scientists also discovered that bats catch prey using their extraordinary sense of hearing. They hear their self-generated high-pitched sounds that bounce off the prey. Not only wild animals but also domestic ones have powerful senses. Bloodhounds, a type of dog, have an amazing sense of smell. It is said that they can even detect certain types of cancer in people.
