1번 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 디자인한 티셔츠를 고르시오.

W: Sam's birthday is coming up soon. What gift should we get her?

M: A T-shirt seems like a perfect present for our little sister.

W: Sounds great. How about designing a T-shirt by ourselves?

M: Cool! Since her birthday is in June, short sleeves will be better than long sleeves.

W: Okay. We can put a picture such as a rabbit or a rainbow on the front.

M: Oh. I think a rabbit is good. She loves animals.

W: Right. Should we add her name, 'SAM', to the front? That would make the T-shirt more unique.

M: Wonderful. I hope she likes the T-shirt we designed.
