【1-3】 대화를 듣고, 남자의 마지막 말에 대한 여자의 응답으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Ms. Collins. There is a mistake on this page.

W: Oh, I typed the wrong word. I'll fix it with some correction tape.

M: No. You shouldn't use correction tape on an application.

4번 대화를 듣고, 남자의 주장으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.
