M: Yeah. People say that it helps you recover your strength after a workout.

The scientists found all the dogs distinguished the identical twins from one another every time. The researchers aren't sure what the dogs are using to tell them apart, but perhaps infections and other factors can change how an individual smells to a dog.

The pomegranate is typically in season from September to February, and it can be stored in the refrigerator for about two months.
