It's also good to get a driver's license in case you have a chance to work in wildlife or safari parks. Finally, try to get some training in public education and public speaking since educating visitors is an important part of being a zookeeper.

M: Good morning, class. We're going to have our midterms soon, so I thought it might be helpful to talk about study techniques. Researchers at Kent State University say they've identified self-quizzing before the big day as one of the best ways to prepare for a test. The research team looked into ten popular studying strategies and evaluated the usefulness of each. They found that self-quizzing on the test material is highly effective and has been shown to boost students' performance across many kinds of exams. Meanwhile, rereading, highlighting, memory tricks, and writing summaries were not very effective and did not improve test performance for most students. Unfortunately, for those who rely on last minute cram sessions, the other study technique that is most effective is spreading out studying over time. However, the same researchers also gave a word of caution, which was that their recommendations might not improve achievement for all students and perhaps would benefit only motivated students who were capable of using those strategies.
