【19-20】 다음을 듣고, 물음에 답하시오.

W: Hello, everyone. According to *Money Magazine*, the average household throws away about fourteen percent of their food because the food is not fresh. For the typical family, that adds up to over \$1,300 worth of food per year. When foods are stored properly, however, they stay fresher for a longer period of time. Here are some examples. First, meat should be kept in its original packaging if you'll eat it in the next day or two. If not, put it in a zipper bag, then store it in your freezer. Next, when you put vegetables such as cabbage in the refrigerator, place some paper towels underneath them. The paper towels will absorb excess moisture and help keep them fresh. Also, try putting an apple in your bag of potatoes. Apples produce a gas which keeps potatoes fresher for a few more weeks. You should also avoid putting your tomatoes in the refrigerator. The juicy texture of tomatoes can't survive the cold. Now, let's take a look at more examples in detail.
