1번 대화를 듣고, 남자의 마지막 말에 대한 여자의 응답으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Good morning, Laura. Where are you going with those clothes?

W: Hi, Jack. I'm on my way to Woodstone Community Center to donate them for a fundraising event.
