W: Hello, students! I'm Ashley Patrick from Safety Education. You probably understand why you should keep a fire extinguisher on your property. However, many people don't know that different kinds of fires need different kinds of fire extinguishers. Let me give you some examples. First, water extinguishers are good for wood fires, and they can also be used for fires caused by paper and fabric. Second, dry powder extinguishers are better for fires caused by flammable liquids such as gasoline, so they're common in factories. Third, wet chemical extinguishers are best for kitchen fires, usually caused by burning oil or fat. They're much safer than the other styles of extinguisher in your kitchen. Finally, carbon dioxide extinguishers are best used in electrical fires. Businesses with computer server rooms should have these extinguishers on hand. Okay. Let's move on to the next topic.
