ANN: 이제 시작하겠습니다.

1번 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 주문할 수건을 고르시오.

M: Darling, I was thinking of a way to show our appreciation to those who will come to our wedding. What do you think about giving a towel as a gift?

W: That sounds lovely. Do you have any specific designs in mind?

M: Hmm... How about designing a towel with a Santa Claus image since our wedding is in December?

W: Oh, that's a good idea. Can we add Rudolph the Reindeer or a snowman?

M: Yes. Rudolph would be great.

W: I agree.

M: Alright. We can put Santa on the left and Rudolph on the right.

W: Awesome! Let's order it.

2번 대화를 듣고, 두 사람이 하는 말의 주제로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Have you watched the documentary film *Sea Crisis*?

M: No, I haven't. What is it about?

5번 대화를 듣고, 남자가 여자에게 전화한 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Hi, Jimin. Is everything going well with you in Australia?

M: Hey, sis! No worries. I made a lot of friends here.

W: I'm glad to hear that, but I miss you so much. You're coming back home soon, right?

M: Yeah, so I'm looking for a gift for Mom and Dad. But I'm having a hard time choosing. Can you recommend something?

W: I think Mom and Dad will like whatever you give them.

M: Hmm... I know, but I want something special.

W: Then, how about a photo album filled with pictures from your time abroad? They'd find that very meaningful.

M: That's a great idea!

6번 대화를 듣고, 여자의 의견으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Mmm... This beef rice noodle is so good! *[Pause]* Uh? Monica, why are you eating only the vegetables? There are so many delicious foods in this buffet.

W: Actually, I'm trying to maintain healthier eating habits these days.

M: Wow, so are you going to be a vegetarian?

W: No. I think eating food in a certain order is good for staying healthy.

M: What made you think so?

W: I read an article suggesting it's better to eat fiber-rich foods first, then protein, and carbohydrates last.

M: Really? Why is that better?

W: It's because taking in carbohydrates last prevents the blood sugar level from increasing rapidly.

7번 대화를 듣고, 남자가 지불할 금액을 고르시오.
