1번 대화를 듣고, 남자의 마지막 말에 대한 여자의 응답으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Honey. I'm trying to bake muffins, but I just realized we're out of eggs.

W: Oh, no! I used the last few eggs for dinner. Do you want me to go to the store?

M: Yes, please. I'll start mixing the other ingredients.

W: Jack, are you able to come to our group meeting tomorrow at 3 p.m. to finish the school art project?

3번 다음을 듣고, 남자가 하는 말의 주제로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: Hi, everyone! You're tuned in to *The Green Tech Minute*. These days, AI is everywhere, helping us work faster and solve complex problems. However, it doesn't come without a cost. Today, I'd like to highlight that using AI systems significantly burdens the environment. For example, a massive amount of electricity is needed to run AI. In addition, AI data centers require millions of liters of water to cool down their servers. This high consumption of resources is a major environmental cost of using AI. So the next time you use AI, please remember it puts a heavy burden on the environment.

4번 다음을 듣고, 여자가 하는 말의 목적으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

W: Good morning, everyone. I'm your tour guide, Beth Thompson. We're about to enter one of the world's most famous historical sites. Before we go inside, I'd like to inform you of some important rules for your visit. First, you're welcome to take photos, but please ensure your flash is turned off to preserve the ancient remains. Second, food and drinks are strictly prohibited inside the site. Finally, for your safety, please do not run as there are many dark areas inside. By following these simple guidelines, everyone can have an enjoyable experience. Now, please follow me inside.

5번 대화를 듣고, 남자의 주장으로 가장 적절한 것을 고르시오.

M: No. My neighbor went to the hospital for an emergency, so I'm looking after her puppy.

W: I see. Then see you at the next class.

M: Sure. Enjoy today's class.

M: Wow! Will there be anything else to enjoy besides the food?

W: Yes. There'll be special performances by well-known local musicians.

13번 Jenny's Pottery Class에 관한 다음 내용을 듣고, 일치하지 않는 것을 고르시오.

W: Good morning! Welcome to Jenny's Pottery Class. In this session, you'll make your own mug using special white clay. This material is very soft and easy to paint on.
