W: Hello! I'm Dr. White from the Space Science Center. Did you know that many commonly-used items began as space inventions? Today, we'll discuss how technology made for space later turned into everyday products. First, sunglasses were used to block out harmful UV lights while astronauts explored space. Today they help to protect our eyes from the sun's damaging UV lights. Second, vacuum cleaners without cords were developed so that astronauts could clear away dirt when they drill for samples on the moon. Now, we can conveniently use these at home. Third, laptops were initially used on a space shuttle mission in 1983 to process data. They were very expensive at that time, but today they've become affordable and most people can't live without them. Finally, although smoke detectors were invented earlier, they were enhanced for space exploration to pick up poisonous gases. Now, they're in almost every room to sense smoke and prevent fire from spreading. Now, let's watch a related video.
