【19-20】 다음을 듣고, 물음에 답하십시오.

W: Hello, everyone. Some animals find their way across thousands of miles without a map. Today, we'll focus on how various creatures use the Earth's magnetic field as a navigation tool. First, sea turtles can detect the specific angle of the magnetic field to find their location in the deep ocean. This ability helps them travel safely back to the beaches where they were born. Second, pigeons have tiny magnetic particles that act like a compass on the magnetic field. This points them in the correct direction of their home even from unfamiliar places. Third, bees have magnetic sensors that help them stay on the right path. These sensors ensure they can fly far away to find food and still return to their hive safely. Finally, salmon remember the unique magnetic signature of the river where they were born. They use this memory to return to the exact same spot years later. Now, let's watch a related video.
